

Portland Literacy Council (PLC) is a nonprofit, all-volunteer organization that supports adult literacy programs, tutors, and students in the greater Portland area through a comprehensive website, online newsletter, annual Tutor Conference, tutor training workshops, GED scholarships, and community grants.

Annual Tutor Conference

Each March, over 100 volunteer tutors, students, and ESOL/ABE education professionals gather at Reed College to refresh and hone teaching skills and techniques. The Annual Tutor Conference is a networking platform that enables adult education advocates to share experiences of students from other cultures and to understand difficulties learners may have faced in the school system. The Annual Tutor Conference is jointly sponsored by Portland Literacy Council and the SEEDS (Students for Education, Empowerment, & Direct Service) Program at Reed College. Many local businesses provide door prizes for the luncheon program.

Tutor Training

In 2016-17, PLC has planned three 2-day workshops for new volunteer tutors. Certified trainers will present content that covers foundations and strategies for teaching listening, speaking, reading, and writing to adults in adult basic education or English classes.

PLC also offers shorter, topic-specific workshops for established tutors, e.g., cultural awareness, working with pre-literate English learners, teaching multi-level groups, and other topics.

GED Testing Scholarships

PLC awards scholarships to pay a portion (or sometimes all) of the mandatory fees associated with taking the GED exams. To qualify for the GED Test Scholarship, students must be 18 years or older, meet residency requirements, and not be currently enrolled in a traditional high school program. Applicants must meet GED-ready criteria to be considered for the scholarships.

Community Grants Program

PLC awards community grants to area non-profits to assist with student scholarships, program set-up, materials, technology upgrades, operating costs, utilities, and similar expenses. In summer 2017, PLC will offer four partial scholarships to attend the LESLLA Conference to be held in Portland August 10-12. The

Low Educated Second Language and Literacy Acquisition (LESLLA) is an international research forum on development of second language skills for pre-literate or low-level literacy adult learners.
