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# Oregon Community Foundation Partners with Portland Literacy Council to Improve Lives through Literacy

Portland, Ore. – Portland Literacy Council (PLC) announced today that it has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from Oregon Community Foundation to support its critical work preparing volunteer tutors for English language learning and adult basic education work.

According to the Adult Education Program Fact Sheet, nearly 250,000 working-age adults in Oregon lack high school-level credentials. This includes more than 70,000 individuals who are navigating life in Oregon while building English language skills. Volunteer literacy tutors play a vital role in supporting these groups as they pursue their goals.

PLC is the central resource in Northwest Oregon for high-quality, low-cost volunteer tutor training programs online and in-person to prepare volunteer tutors for English language learning and adult basic education work. "This grant strengthens our capacity to train and support volunteers who are changing lives through literacy," said Lorie Wigle, PLC's Executive Director. "With these funds, we'll be able to grow our outreach, improve our tutor training curriculum, and deepen our partnerships with adult education providers across the region."

The funding includes support from the William Swindells, Sr. Memorial Fund of Oregon Community Foundation.

Portland Literacy Council trains more than 200 volunteer literacy tutors each year, hosts an annual volunteer literacy tutor conference, and supports adults seeking to complete a GED®--all in active partnership with other programs in our region. PLC's contact database of adult literacy tutors and advocates is an asset that the entire ecosystem uses to place volunteers in high-value roles. Through training and connecting tutors with literacy programs, PLC helps tutors best serve adult literacy learners, supporting the development of the essential English language and literacy skills needed to thrive.
